Dear Ilisagvik Students:

On behalf of President Brower, we would like to thank you all again for your patience and your faith in Ilisagvik during this challenging time. We continue to monitor the circumstances and guidance related to COVID-19, and I am writing today with an update. The gravity of the pandemic locally continues to grow by the day. Since my last email, the number of cases have increased within Alaska to 133 (as of today) confirmed cases with the most recent case in Prudhoe Bay. Due to these circumstances, and out of concern for the health and wellbeing of our community, our campus will remain closed until **April 10th, 2020** with the majority of staff and faculty tele-working from home.

Ilisagvik students remain our number one priority and we will continue to do our best to provide resources, support, and accommodations to minimize disruption to your education and lives. In that spirit, we would like to advise you of the following:

- All classes will continue via online or distance delivery for remainder of the semester.
